

Research Objective & Technical Specifications

- OBJECTIVE: The non-profit organization ACTIVE DADS FOR THE RIGHTS OF THE CHILD
 assigned Focus Bari S.A. to conduct a Panhellenic Telephone Survey to an adult audience, in
 order to obtain information on the views of Greeks on the issues of parental equality and child
 custody as well as answers to questions about whether Greeks decide which politicians to
 vote for or not, influenced by the positions of the candidates (politicians or parties) on issues
 related to child custody.
- POPULATION COVERED: Men-Women, 18-74 years old, Greece
- ESTIMATE OF COVERED POPULATION (IN '000 PEOPLE): 7.659 (EL.STAT./Census 2019)
- DATA COLLECTION METHOD: Telephone interviews (C.A.T.I.*) using the specialized VOXCO SOFTWARE (www.voxco.com)
- SAMPLING: Random selection of landline and cellular telephone numbers formed by special telephone
 call management software (VOXCO), based on the prefixes assigned in the coverage areas by EETT to
 OTE (GR Communications Organization) and the ALTERNATIVE telecommunication service providers.
 Interviews were performed only for tel. numbers corresponding to permanent residences within the
 coverage areas. Sample take was an interview performed per household. For the actual representation
 of the public, quotas were applied to the total sample in terms of gender, age groups and area of
 residence, according to the proportions of each group of the actual population.
- SAMPLE SIZE: 1.000 people
- SAMPLE ERROR: 3,1% (Confidence Interval 95%)
- AVERAGE DURATION OF COMPLETING A QUESTIONNAIRE: 6'04"
- DATE OF CONDUCT: 7-16/10/2020
- AUDIT (MET BY FOCUS BARI INSPECTORS): At14,4% of sample










Summary of Key Findings

Basis: Men-Women, 18-74 years old, Total Greek Population (in '000 people): 7.659, Sample: 1.000 people





Excluding yourself, is there anyone in **your inner family circle** who is **a divorced parent with minor children**?




- Positive is the stance of the vast majority of Greek citizens regarding the reform of Family Law towards shared custody among divorced parents with minor children, with 88,8% of the public (6.8 million people) stating their personal stance is positive/ very Positive towards this reform.
- Respectively, one in two Greeks (47,8%) is convinced that the stance of our fellow citizens is positive towards this reform, while a significant part of the public, is convinced that the stance of the Greeks in respect to this matter is neutral (32%).
- The issues of parental equality and custody between divorced parents, concern more than one in three Greeks, as according to the research, 37,8% (2.9 million people) of the public has in their familial environment (family circle) divorced parents with minor children.






Summary of Key Findings

Basis: Men-Women, 18-74 years old, Total Greek Population (in '000 people): 7.659, Sample: 1.000 people







- 82,8% of the total, believe that the choices of Greek voters can be influenced by the positions of parties or politicians on issues of shared parental custody and upbringing, while a corresponding percentage (79%) believe that it may have cost politically in previous governments or individuals the incapability to legally protect the children of divorced parents.
- Finally, almost one in two Greeks (47% / 3.6 million people) stated that the position of a politician or party in matters of parental custody could affect their personal choice.
